Psalm 34, "Of David, when he changed his behavior before Abimelech, so that he drove him out, and he went away."

1 Samuel 21-22.

"I sought the LORD, and he answered me and delivered me from all my \_\_\_\_\_."

*"...God is not asking us to pretend that the realities of life, the pressures, and stresses are small or insignificant before we come to Him...He invites us to come honestly."*
