2.	NOTICE: Our focus in the Chill study is to rethink how we deal with stress and find true rest. This lesson we'll look at how we can confidently hide in God. What imagery do you find in this Psalm that portrays this truth? Consider how David illustrates where, when, and why he can hide in God.
3.	REVIEW: What three truths about God does David announce at the beginning of this Psalm?
4.	Consider how God can be your light, salvation, and defense. How do these traits of God look in your life today? Write or draw your how you see this truth:

1.	SHARE: How did you and your best friend become close?
2.	REVIEW: Reading back through Psalm 27, what clues do you see that David's relationship with God is very personal? Consider especially verses 1, 4-5, and 7-8
3.	CONSIDER: How do you think David became this close and confident in God?
4.	APPLY: In what ways would you like your relationship with God to be more like David's relationship?
5.	Write a verse from Psalm 27 that will be a reminder to you today of how personal your relationship with God can and should be:

1.	Read Psalm 13. What is troubling David in this Psalm?
2.	THINK: What is David's rationale in his call to God? Consider Psalm 13:3-4.
3.	CONNECT: Do you relate to David's feelings in Psalm 13? Why or why not?
4. 	Consider Psalm 13:1 and Psalm 27:9. What deep reality in David's heart do his words reveal to you?
5. 	Write a verse from Psalm 13 or 27 that you can share with a friend who is struggling today:

Lesson Two ... Day Five: Write & Memorize the Word

... Dwell in the Word...

Read Psalm 27 from the Amplified Bible - You can find this version on a phone app like YouVersion or online at BibleGateway·com, BibleHub·com or other online Bible resources·

1.	Skim through Psalm 27 and find any solid references to who God is, who He will be, and how He will respond to us when we trust Him. (Hint: look for key verbs, "is", "will", "are.")
2.	APPLY: Sometimes, because of our past experiences with people we have hoped would be trustworthy, we may find it difficult to trust in God. "I want to trust in God. I feel like I should, but I'n having trouble really hiding in Him." This may be you, this may be someone you love. How can the truths of Psalm 27 be an encouragement to you or to those you love?
3.	Consider all the statements that show David's trust and confidence in God. Which do you desire most today?
4.	Write a verse from Psalm 27 that you can meditate on today to remind you of the truth of who God is in your life:

Read Psalm 27 from the Living Bible or the Message·
L. THINK: What "one thing" - that really is three - does David ask of the Lord?
2. CONSIDER: What does that say about David's priorities? Consider this: David was the king of an entire nation when he wrote this Psalm.
How will David's priorities influence yours today?
3. APPLY: What are David's requests in Psalm 27:11-12? How could you make similar requests of God today?
4. KNOW: Who is hiding from whom in Psalm 27:5? What does this say to you about the love of God for those who trust in Him?
Write out a verse from Psalm 27 that speaks an affirmation of what David has done or intends to do — an "I have" or "I shall" or "I will" statement. Select a statement that you are committed to doing as well.

Psalm 27:5

···Create and Share the Word···

Today is our "Create & Share" day· We've been rethinking the stresses in our life and how we respond to them· Our goal is to think biblically about stress and truly find a God-honoring rest· Consider the final verses of Psalm 27 and what David believes and then reminds himself – and all those who will be reading this Psalm – to do· Read Psalm 27:13-14 and consider if you can affirm the same in your life today· Do you believe that you will "look upon the goodness of the Lord in the land of the living?" Will you truly "wait for the LORD?" Will you "be strong, and let your heart take courage?"

Sometimes it's easier said than done.

Maybe you feel strong today…but when the moment of stress comes, you fall apart and you fall back to your old patterns of stress and anxiety.

Think about a truth about God that you can count on today.

Now, think about something God has created - the ocean, the mountains, a towering natural structure, a strong tree, a simple flower - something that reminds you of the goodness of God.

Draw that below (or post a photo of it if you're not confident in your drawing) and write over or around it the words from Psalm 27 that will remind you to hide in Him because you can "look upon the goodness of the Lord in the land of the living."

Share your creation and encourage someone else today also.

Do not reject me or forsake me, God my Savior.


¹⁰Though my father and mother forsake me, the Lord will receive me.


¹¹Teach me your way, Lord; lead me in a straight path because of my oppressors.
