Read Psalm 145 from the Amplified version.

1. **THINK:** Do you have a nickname? Pet name? What does it mean or how did you get that name?

2. Read Exodus 3:13-15. What does God tell Moses? Why?

This is a defining moment for the people of God in that from this point forward they would know the presonal name of the Almighty God· The Hebrew spelling of God's name is - pronounced: "yod-hey-vavhey." God is referred by this name 5,410 times in the Old Testament. Because the Hebrew alphabet has no vowel letters it is unclear what the original pronunciation of the word was. Some people pronounce the name "Yahweh" and others (mostly Christians) as Jehovah Jewish law forbids the speaking of God's name aloud, and so pseudonyms are used, such as Adonai (Lord), Yah (God), Elohim (God) and HaShem (The Name). Many scholars agree that "Yahweh" is a close pronunciation. This four-letter name is referred to as the "tetragrammaton" from "four + letters." The root of the word means "to be," and some have understood the original meaning to be "He-Who-Is," or "He who brings being into being." Bible translators will spell the tetragrammaton in all capital letters to indicated this name of God. So, when you see "LORD" in your Bible you can know it is referring to יהוה "Yahweh" or simply "Yah·"

- 3. Review Psalm 145 and note every instance of "LORD." Write "יהוה" in the margin of your Bible along with any reminders of the significance of this name. How many times does David refer to God as LORD in this Psalm?
- 4. **Consider** this: God didn't have to reveal himself to Moses in this personal way. What does this say to you about our God that He did reveal Himself in this way?
