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



2. 🖞 We come from varying religious & political backgrounds. Remember: 'In essentials, unity; in nonessentials, liberty; in all things, charity.'

3. O Avoid commentaries or study notes in your Bible - do your own thinking. Trust God, pray, ask for wisdom then read and answer on your own.

4. We're all learning. Be gracious and patient with yourself and with others. No one has it all figured out.

5. 7 A This is a Bible study - not a personal-opinion group. So, there are going to be "right" and "wrong" answers in keeping with the truth of God's Word.

6. • Share or Listen. You don't have to share, but if you did the reading and responded to that prompt, why not chime in? We all benefit from one another's thoughts and questions. I bet you have something great to share!

7. 🖄 Done or Not Done...Come. Didn't finish the study this week? That's ok. Life gets busy. You're here! Yay, you! This will be a good week for you to listen and be encouraged by others.

8. X Be considerate. Share your thoughts on questions you completed and allow time for others to do the same - limit yourself to about 2 minutes maximum and try to stay on topic. Your group leader will help with that.

9. 🙏 Pray. Pray when you arrive, while you're in Grace Groups, during teaching time. Pray for your understanding to grow. Pray for your Grace Group leaders. Pray for one another. Let's be women who go to the Father for one another and seek His face together.

... My Heart to Yours ...

It's amazing to me how quickly I'll get to sleep when I put on some white noise. The static hum filters out the rest of the sounds and even the chatter in my own mind fades so I can sleep. I have an app now that offers not only white but options for brown and even pink noise. I can choose settings that bring in the noises of a busy street, a babbling brook, or a blowing wind. I have a friend who falls asleep to episodes of

"The Office" or "Friends" because she's so familiar with the banter that it's like white noise to her. Sounds that can be white noise work if they are not too loud or specific. They need to be familiar enough so we can relax in the predictability. Is it possible that the truths of our faith can become like white noise? So common are the images and themes that we almost don't see or hear them any more. We can go about our lives with these truths humming somewhere in the background-unnoticed. When faced with serious sin issues in the church Paul alerted the Corinthians to a truth that had become, in a sense, white noise to them – the Cross. Did you catch that in your reading? Division, quarreling, jealsousy, strife, immaturity – Paul points them back to one place – the Cross for the fix. Had the truth of the Cross **not** been lost on them, would they have been so defined by their sins? If the power of God through the Cross hadn't faded into white noise, would they have been so prone to gather under the names of Peter or Apollos or Paul? No, with the Cross so present it is large and loud in our view – it's right there reminding us of our greatest hope – God's power and our changed lives because of what He accomplished at the Cross. Bring the Cross to the front of your thoughts throughout the rest of this study and the foolishness of the Cross will make you truly wise. And know as always, that you are loved and prayed for,
