



... Grace Groups Guidelines ...

- 1. God's Word is our standard. We'll use the Bible not personal opinion, popular teachers, or church tradition as our guide for everything. We are using the New English Translation (NET) Bible for this study, but you can use any trustworthy Bible translation (not a paraphrase) to study from.
- 2. We come from varying religious & political backgrounds. Remember: 'In essentials, unity; in non-essentials, liberty; in all things, charity.'
- **3.** Avoid commentaries or study notes in your Bible do your own thinking. Trust God, pray, ask for wisdom then read and answer on your own.
- 4. We're all learning. Be gracious and patient with yourself and with others. No one has it all figured out.
- 5. This is a Bible study not a personal-opinion group. So, there are going to be "right" and "wrong" answers in keeping with the truth of God's Word.
- 6. Share or Listen. You don't have to share, but if you did the reading and responded to that prompt, why not chime in? We all benefit from one another's thoughts and questions. I bet you have something great to share!
- 7. Done or Not Done...Come. Didn't finish the study this week? That's ok. Life gets busy. You're here! Yay, you! This will be a good week for you to listen and be encouraged by others.
- 8. De considerate. Share your thoughts on questions you completed and allow time for others to do the same limit yourself to about 2 minutes maximum and try to stay on topic. Your group leader will help with that.



... My Heart to Yours...

When I was about seven years old, I walked into the kitchen where my mom was drying dishes, and standing a bit behind her I asked with big, hopeful eyes, "Mommy, can I have..."

At that time in that season of our little family's life we were living in a parsonage behind our church where my dad was the pastor of small, new congregation. We lived the simple and tightly budgeted life of a pastor's family. My mom cooked every meal, sewed many of our clothes, and created a home from the donations of food, clothing, furniture, and appliances we were blessed to receive from kind church members. Where money was sparce love abounded...but money was still sparce and life was a challenge for my parents as a young couple in full-time ministry with three children.

So, when her little girl came with pleading eyes with a request for something, my mom in that moment felt the tug of a mother wanting to give her child anything she desired and the counter pull of a wife and woman feeling the pressure of being a pastor's wife and living on less than \$100 a week. And in that moment instead of waiting for me to finish my request my weary mother turned from the sink counter, interrupted me, and said in an uncharacteristically impatient tone, "You can't have anything."

... silence...

She knew she had spoken harshly. My little eyes grew big and welled up with little tears, I lowered my head, and my hands came up to my chin clutching a small photo I had clipped from a magazine. She must have been up to "here" with bills and requests and "life" and in that moment I may as well be asking for a horse or the moon. She felt pain of disappointing me as she imagined her inability to grant any wish at all. I looked back up to her, handed her the crumpled photo, and said, sheepishly, "...all I wanted was a turtle." My mom's heart melted and she actually smiled a bit, caught off guard by my request and perhaps her own overreaction. Set her dish towel aside and pulled me close to her.

The cares and distractions of married life, mom life, and life in general all had overcome her, but in that moment, we connected over hopes and desires and all that we wanted and couldn't have, longed for and might find a way to get. Above all, my mom and I had a moment to thank God together for what He was providing and that even if we couldn't feed another mouth at that time, we had reason to look to our heavenly Father for the greater mission we had in Him. I don't recall every detail, but I have a lasting memory that my mom was pointing me to Jesus and how our lives - as distracted by cares and concerns as they can get - should always be aimed at our higher calling. I know her mission was to help me see and secure my undivided devotion to the Lord. I pray that in this coming lesson you too will see the great calling of the kingdom and know that you have a great mission as well.



Today, as we wrap up, we're going to revisit a simple and well-loved illustration to keep as a lasting reminder of our call to glorify God in our bodies and with the same goal in mind that Paul had as he ministered to the Corinthians 2000 years ago.

MATERIALS

- 16oz Mason jar with lid
- 3x3" fabric square
- 10-12" yarn or jute
- 5-6 smooth stones or walnuts
- ½ Cup pebbles or ½" wooden beads
- 1 ½ C rice or sand
- The "Girl with Heart" tag
- Markers or paint

Directions

- 1. Join me on YouTube to do this Create & Share together.
- 2. This is not a "Priorities Jar" That's the classic (worldly) use of this illustration. This is different. As a Christian, it's God's calling, your mission and identity that are in focus. As you paint your stones, keep that in mind.
- 3. Wash the stones and write words that remind you of your priorities as a saint, called by God based on your reading through 1 Corinthians. A Sharpie or white paint pen works well.
- 4. Place the stones in the jar followed by the pebbles, then fill to the top with rice.
- 5. Place the fabric across the seal on top of the jar then screw on the lid to keep it in place.
- 6. Tie a ribbon around the mouth of the jar
- 7. Trim the girl with a heart tag.
- 8. Write your Bible verse 1 Corinthians 6:19-20 in the first person "I am not my own..." on the back of the girl/heart tag and tie her to your jar.

9. Use your jar in your home as a daily reminder of living a holy life as a saint called to live in undivided devotion to the Lord.
