



...Grace Group... .Guidelines.

- 1. God's Word is our standard. We'll use the Bible not personal opinion, popular teachers, or church tradition as our guide for everything. We are using the New English Translation (NET) Bible for this study, but you can use any trustworthy Bible translation (not a paraphrase) to study from.
- 2. We come from varying religious & political backgrounds. Remember: 'In essentials, unity; in non-essentials, liberty; in all things, charity.'
- **3.** Avoid commentaries or study notes in your Bible do your own thinking. Trust God, pray, ask for wisdom then read and answer on your own.
- 4. We're all learning. Be gracious and patient with yourself and with others. No one has it all figured out.
- 5. This is a Bible study not a personal-opinion group. So, there are going to be "right" and "wrong" answers in keeping with the truth of God's Word.
- 6. Share or Listen. You don't have to share, but if you did the reading and responded to that prompt, why not chime in? We all benefit from one another's thoughts and questions. I bet you have something great to share!
- 7. Done or Not Done...Come. Didn't finish the study this week? That's ok. Life gets busy. You're here! Yay, you! This will be a good week for you to listen and be encouraged by others.
- 8. Me Be considerate. Share your thoughts on questions you completed and allow time for others to do the same limit yourself to about 2 minutes maximum and try to stay on topic. Your group leader will help with that.
- 9. A Pray. Pray when you arrive, while you're in Grace Groups, during teaching time. Pray for your understanding to grow. Pray for your Grace Group leaders. Pray for one another. Let's be women who go to the Father for one another and seek His face together.

... My Heart to Yours...

What's the first word you remember saying - or were told you said as a baby? "dada"?... "mama"? ... "no!"? I don't remember the first English word but I do - oddly - recall the first Greek word I learned. Growing up a PK (Pastor's Kid) you learn a little differently. And growing up the child of parents who were both teachers and both had a passion for words and in particular - God's Word - you can add another layer of "differently" to that. A family story that we shared often was about the time we were moving from San Diego up to Simi Valley, California. My dad got his first full-time lead pastor position, leaving his youth pastor job we were on our way up the 5 freeway a caravan of trucks and vans. Apparently, I was in the cab of one of the moving trucks with a burly guy from our church. He, along with several college kids from my dad's youth group had all turned out to help pack up our home and help us move. I was seated in the middle between him and another helper and, so the story goes, he was trying to make the three-hour drive as pleasant as he could and he did two things that definitely helped. He had donuts and he had some good questions ready. After I finished my

first donut he asked a question that he was pretty sure a little girl would be able to answer, "Can you say your ABC's?" And I began to proudly and gleefully sing them for him in that familiar melody just the way my dad had taught me, "alpha-betagamma-delta-epsilon-zeta..." all the way from alpha to omega I sang out my ABCs - only in Greek! My first word may not have been in Greek, but the first alphabet I remember being able to sing was! Preparing this study I couldn't help think of that story. I read familiar words in Greek as I reviewed to understand their meanings and two stood out to me - because I distinctly recall learning these from my father as he'd preach. "Agape" - the divine, unconditional love that God first showed us and we can only live out in His Spirit, and "parakalehoh" - a word I found funny to say and loved hearing my dad pronounce it for me. It means "walking alongside to encourage or comfort." Growing up in a word-rich home I absorbed words and their meanings like a sponge and these are two that have been deep in me for as long as I can remember. What a blessing to have not just those words and their meanings - that would be empty - but to have parents who exemplified both so well to me. It's agape that is the beginning and the end and the foundation of all - the greatest of these. It's parakalehoh that fleshes out that love, gives it feet and lets you see and be encouraged or exhorted when need be. That's what I pray this study will lead you to as well. That you'll grasp the more deeply the great love God has shown you and see how you have been given parakalehoh through His Word, His Spirit, and even His people to come alongside you. I pray that you'll look for and find these and even more powerful words of love and light as you study in the days ahead, and that you'll know as you do that you are loved and prayed for...
