

...Grace Group... .Guidelines.

- 1. God's Word is our standard. We'll use the Bible not personal opinion, popular teachers, or church tradition as our guide for everything. We are using the New English Translation (NET) Bible for this study, but you can use any trustworthy Bible translation (not a paraphrase) to study from.
- 2. We come from varying religious & political backgrounds. Remember: 'In essentials, unity; in non-essentials, liberty; in all things, charity.'
- **3.** Avoid commentaries or study notes in your Bible do your own thinking. Trust God, pray, ask for wisdom then read and answer on your own.
- 4. We're all learning. Be gracious and patient with yourself and with others. No one has it all figured out.
- 5. This is a Bible study not a personal-opinion group. So, there are going to be "right" and "wrong" answers in keeping with the truth of God's Word.
- 6. Share or Listen. You don't have to share, but if you did the reading and responded to that prompt, why not chime in? We all benefit from one another's thoughts and questions. I bet you have something great to share!
- 7. Zone or Not Done...Come. Didn't finish the study this week? That's ok. Life gets busy. You're here! Yay, you! This will be a good week for you to listen and be encouraged by others.
- 8. De considerate. Share your thoughts on questions you completed and allow time for others to do the same limit yourself to about 2 minutes maximum and try to stay on topic. Your group leader will help with that.
- 9. A Pray. Pray when you arrive, while you're in Grace Groups, during teaching time. Pray for your understanding to grow. Pray for your Grace Group leaders. Pray for one another. Let's be women who go to the Father for one another and seek His face together.

... My Heart to Yours ...

I was watching a movie recently that had a scene where one of the actors was caught underwater. She had to hold her breath and swim for her life against the waves away from the danger behind her. She battled the current, carrying her load under water, swimming frantically all while holding-holding her breath...and I found that I was holding mine with her!

I would catch myself enveloped in the drama then release my own breath and continue watching the scene nervously clutching the arm of the sofa. When she finally and barely at the last final moment made it up and out of the water, she collapsed in safety on the shore, her arms weak and spent in the effort, gasping in relief as she gulped and coughed to bring air into her body. Freed from the crushing pressure of the deep water, free from the danger of the ocean filling her lungs, she lay sprawled on the shore tired from the battle behind her and grateful for escaping death as she sucked in the life-giving air and gathered herself for the next harrowing scene. I too, gathered myself, brought back into reality, releasing my grip on the sofa and letting out the air I had been holding in sympathy with her. I was in no danger. I was free to breathe at any time, but the drama had pulled me in so well that I couldn't help but identify with the woman.

I thought about this as I was studying through our passages in 2 Corinthians. How I identified with the "ministry of death" and "condemnation" that envelops those who are held under the law. Like the actress in that harrowing scene, many of those I love are drowning. Sadly, unlike the lady swimming for her life, they are unaware that they are captives under the water. In sympathy, I find myself holding my breath knowing they are in danger of drowning in a sense - not from water of course, but from sin and the condemnation weighing them down. I have come out of the danger. I am in freedom now breathing the air and filled with the Spiri. That release - the gasping, sprawling, thankful release of joy when that woman came up out of what would have been, could have been her tomb is me - or how I picture myself gasping for joy as I breathe in the sweet air of liberty and freedom because of what Christ rescued me out of. Oh, how I long for those I love to breathe deeply and embrace the life-giving air of freedom in Christ. That's why Jesus came, "to give life, and life abundantly!" It is for "freedom He set us free!" No longer drowning, I am with the Lord and "where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom." I pray today for you to know and rejoice in that freedom. I pray for those we love as well, who are still under the law of death, that they will as we do, know the great relief of freedom we have in Him.
