



Lesson Nine Day One



... Welcome to the Wilderness ...

"Numbers" gets its name from the three times God calls for a census, but a better title is "In the Wilderness" because that's where the entire account takes place. This is actually the title in the Hebrew Bible taken from the first verse: "The LORD spoke to Moses bamidbar - in the wilderness (desert)..."

It's been a year and two months since YHWH saved and set His people apart and they've been busy. In the Leviticus account they camped at Mt. Sinai, built the Tabernacle for the LORD, received instructions – Torah - for living, received the 10 Words ("Commandments") and laws for holy living. But, hanging out with God at Sinai isn't the final plan. God had declared that He would, "bring them up out of that land to a land flowing with milk and honey" (Ex 3:8.)

Numbers is the account of their wilderness travel from Sinai to that Promised Land, but it is so much more. It is the account of how God continued to reveal Himself and fulfil the promises He made to Abraham 600 years earlier when God told him to, "go to the land that I will show you...to your offspring I will give this land" (Gen 12:1-7.) That land? Canaan. That's where God's people are now heading.

The long awaited promise of a land of their own is just a few days' journey away, but, as we'll see *in the wilderness*, God's people have a long way to go before they will be able to come into the Land.

We will see our own selves in these chapters - living in the wilderness, trusting God, waiting, failing, trusting again.

Like Israel, we too are rough and rebellious, "prone to wander" as the hymn sings. We will see what Paul wrote that we are not to set our hearts on evil things...be sexually immoral...put God to the test...or gripe and complain...(1 Cor. 10:6-10.)

(tzitzit)

Many rabbinic traditions surround the tzitzit - but we can see clearly what YHWH's words about the tassels were: "make tassels on the corners of their garments throughout their generations...put a cord of blue on the tassel of each corner" (Num 15:37-41) Allow the time to create your own tzitzit to be a meditative and prayerful experience. Invite your Grace Group to join you. Make tzitzit with your children or grandchildren and explain what the tassels represent. Then wear your tzitzit when we meet again. Supplies are simple: 4 strands of yarn, embroidery thread, or similar material.
