

Lesson Eleven 20 Day One

... My Heart to Yours ...

Welcome to "The Words" - the Hebrew title for this book of the Bible - הַדְּבָרִים (had-debar-im)

In a very real sense, the words of Deuteronomy, are Moses' own "My Heart to Yours." He has walked with the people of Yahweh for over 40 years. He is 120 years old and these are his final words to a people, a nation, his brothers and sisters in YHWH and his own dear family.

As I studied to prepare this lesson I found myself immersed in the devarim (words) that YHWH graced Moses to give.

And more than immersed in the words, I was taken away...back to the wilderness. I could almost feel the dust beneath my feet as I imagined myself standing, eyes up toward my leader, my dear, bold - very human - shepherd-leader as the Ruach carried the devarim across the land, over and through every heart and mind...

...sometimes booming, sometimes weeping, sometimes trembling...always impassioned.

His love and zeal filling each word. He speaks with heaviness and yet hope for us to know what he has learned...years of longing and struggle...his own personal successes and failures like the jots and tittles of every letter bringing clarity and meaning and helping me to love YHWH my God even more.

The shekinah glow of God's glory has faded but his passion has only increased. I imagine seeing his wrinkled, bearded face etched with years of face-to-face moments with the one true God – what a privilege – every wrinkle I see reminds me of the blessing he received and was graced to survive – panim el panim – the only one who had a one-to-one with YHWH Elohim.

Oh, to be with him in the wilderness! I found myself longing to stand next to him on the path or walk beside him in the way. To eat a meal - a miracle manna breakfast and main course of quail - to break bread and drink wine. I imagine his laugh is the deep-barreled laugh of a man who knows and is known and has nothing but transparency left so he can belt out a joke and a take one in return with joy and zest for life.

He's seen so much death...and yet he seen more life than any of us as he's braced the power of YHWH Himself. That's why he can laugh so deeply...at least in my thoughts of him. He's full to capacity and overflowing with life.

I see in Moses a man of longing...longing for wholeness for himself and his people. ...longing for a land of promise - a land he will only lead others to. But for Moses, his longing was completely fulfilled in the God he knew and Who knew him so well. ...longing for his people to do right, to love the LORD their God with heart, soul, mind, and strength...

My heart to yours is that same longing...that you would know - really know - the incredible gift of knowing God. That nothing else would satisfy - no books or seminars, devotionals or workshops - nothing but the Word.

As you move through and dwell in the passages ahead of us today, I am longing for you, praying for you, hoping that you will release any resistance you have to fully loving God and embrace what it means to be His child in the fullest most all-encompassing way.

...that you would grasp and experience living by nothing else but *every word that comes from the mouth of the LORD*.



One of the best ways to learn and grow is to teach. God was very clear about this to Moses: Gather the people to me, that I may let them hear my words, so that they may learn to fear me all the days that they live on the earth, and that they **may teach** their children so. (Dt. 4:10)

Psalm 119 - our Write the Word for this lesson - extols David's longing to be taught. 27 times "teach" occurs in the Old Testament - nearly half of those times

is in this Psalm that is all about God's Torah. The Very Word: "Torah" itself implies teaching - it means

"instruction." Who do you think was the most enthusiastic God-lover in all of Israel?

Moses! Why? Because he spent so much time with God, yes..

and he spent hours and hours teaching the

b'nim YHWH Elohim (sons of YHWH Elohim/children of the LORD God)

So...it's your turn...for our Create & Share I am inviting you to write Day Nine of this lesson. Here's how: Follow the same procedure I have given for every lesson -

it is literally the exact approach I personally take every time I write these lessons. First I...

Pause & Pray - asking God for wisdom, clarity, love, words as I study and think about how to teach it through an engaging lesson. Then I...

Memorize & Meditate - reviewing a key verse and mediate as I commit it to memory. Next I...

Simply Read. I just open the Bible, no commentaries, no helps, nothing but me and the Word with the Holy Spirit to guide me. Finally, I...

Write the Word. writing a passage or a verse and making notes - along with that I...

Read (again) & **Engage**. This is the part that you end up working with. From my reading I take it deeper, get my Hebrew root words out (Biblehub.com) get several other translations for comparison (Biblegateway.com) and refer to trusted teachers who've gone before me and know more: Spurgeon, Henry, Keil and Delitzsch, and others. **My goal** is to ask questions and provide prompts that *invite you to engage* in the Word so that you can see, understand, and know for yourself. The Day Nine pages are your blank canvas.

Read the passage then Create & Share questions, prompts, ideas, that engage in the Word and bless the women in our group.

Think about how this passage points to YHWH's Promises, Priorities, and Plans for Israel and by extension...you and me. Any question you have about the text as you read is a great starting point to ask that question and get others thinking. Notice from the previous day (Dt. 12:29-13:18) how God through Moses did this very thing. He anticipated questions, situations, issues and set His people up for wise responses based on the principles of His truth. I will be available to help you in any way. I really am hoping you'll embrace this. It is the heart of all I desire to leave you with as I try in the strength of the Spirit to sincerely let the Word of Christ dwell in me richly...and to teach and shepherd in such a way that you would be encouraged and equipped to do the same.

This is my heart to yours. Truly it is.

- 1) Avoid asking questions that can be answered, "Yes" or "no" or ask, followed by asking for a rationale for that response.
- 2) Offer a prompt that engages different learning styles:
 - a. Left brain thinkers prefer linear questions who, what, when, where; graphs, charts, maps outlines
 - b. right brain thinkers prefer open-ended prompts, philosophical motivation, art, drawing, creative expression, imagination
 - c. auditory learners appreciate words that evoke something they can hear
 - d. visual learners engage well with graphics and drawings
 - e. What's your style? be sure to ask questions you would like to answer and then challenge yourself to ask ask a question that you think would be hard for you but maybe easier for someone else
- 3) Don't worry about what other people (including me!) will think Just enjoy the process and be you!
- 4) Trust the Holy Spirit. I pray, pray, pray A LOT A LOT A LOT as I read, study, write, rewrite and try again.
- 5) Look back on previous lessons and get ideas from questions and prompts that you've enjoyed before.
- 6) One of the reasons I selected this day to have you do is because it has a lot of review material! Go back to the lessons where we covered this content! Get inspiration from there!
