

We come from varying religious & political backgrounds. Remember: 'In essentials, unity; in non-essentials, liberty; in all things, charity.'

OAvoid commentaries or study notes in your Bible – do your own thinking. Trust God, pray, ask for wisdom then read and answer on your own.

We're all learning. Be gracious and patient with yourself and with others. No one has it all figured out.

√ A This is a Bible study – not a personal-opinion group. So, there are going to be "right" and "wrong" answers in keeping with the truth of God's Word.

A You don't have to share, but if you did the reading and the study this week, why not chime in? We all benefit from one another's thoughts and questions. I bet you have something great to share!

igo Discussion questions are written with care to move you through the previous lesson and prepare you for the lesson to come. Please read and answer them all and do not skip over any.

Cidn't finish the study this week? That's ok. Life gets busy. You're here! Yay you! This will be a good week for you to listen and perhaps jot down thoughts as others share.



When it comes to referring to God, the English language is limited. If we're referring to a mythological being we say "god" – lowercase 'g.' We use a capital "G" if we're referring to the God of a specific faith, namely Christianity. But, if you've known God, experienced God, seen God at work in your life and the lives of others...if you have felt His presence, been comforted by His peace, and assured by your faith in Him, then you know God beyond those three limiting letters G-O-D.

As you dwell in the Word throughout this lesson consider who God is and how He reveals Himself to people. Think about His name and how that connects personally and significantly to the way He engages and the situations in which He reveals Himself.

Consider how you have come to know God. How you have grown in your faith from a child-like moment to how you are understanding God better today. Think about how has He revealed Himself to you through your Bible study, teaching, prayer, situations, and quiet thoughtful moments.

Then, without using any Biblical wording or name of God (God, Yahweh, Elohim, etc.) write about God as you have known Him. You may have one incident or countless.

Write as many as you can think of and connect that name -or nickname, rather- with the incident, experience, emotional moment in your life.

Use the phrase "the One who…" if that is helpful as you think about who God is and has been to you throughout your life and in your walk of faith. I've provided four spaces on the next page to record your thoughts and experiences.

EXAMPLE:

I was crying to God in prayer after yet another month of infertility. We had been trying for over six years and I was so sad, lonely, and questioning.

I can't explain it, but pressed upon my heart to study the Bible and read any account of barrenness I could find. He nudged me toward His word and I found great comfort and guidance in my study. Less than a year later we were pregnant. God has been: "the One who nudges me"

A WORD OF CAUTION: Approach this exercise with reverence and integrity. Reverence for the God of the universe about whom you are carefully and thoughtfully describing. Integrity in how you take your personal experience and connect that to your sense of God's presence in your life. You are not conforming God to your image or momentary feelings. This is not an exercise in re-naming God. This is you considering a personal way to speak of God that anchors His true impact on your life in a given moment and allows you to share more personally about who He is beyond the limits of the English language.
