





We come from varying religious & political backgrounds. Remember: 'In essentials, unity; in non-essentials, liberty; in all things, charity.'

OAvoid commentaries or study notes in your Bible – do your own thinking. Trust God, pray, ask for wisdom then read and answer on your own.

We're all learning. Be gracious and patient with yourself and with others. No one has it all figured out.

♥ A This is a Bible study – not a personal-opinion group. So, there are going to be "right" and "wrong" answers in keeping with the truth of God's Word.

You don't have to share, but if you did the reading and the study this week, why not chime in? We all benefit from one another's thoughts and questions. I bet you have something great to share!

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Cidn't finish the study this week? That's ok. Life gets busy. You're here! Yay you! This will be a good week for you to listen and perhaps jot down thoughts as others share.

6. "Let me tell you about this place..." Imagine the scene: Jacob is finally back at Bethel, but this time is quite different than the last time he was there. Review Genesis 28:10-22 and think about how Jacob might be feeling his first night back at Bethel. Consider who he was then and who is now. He has a lot to reflect on. He gathers his wives and children of all ages in the midst of their tents and animals, seated by a crackling fire under the stars, Jacob recounts with thoughtful, perhaps sentimental reflection and wonder his first time at Bethel and why this is such a special place: *(For those of you artfully inclined, consider including an illustration this moment.)*

- 5. Let Scripture Interpret Scripture. This is the first time that a "drink offering" (35:14) is mentioned in Scripture. Consider the following passages and see if that helps you grasp the significance of Jacob's actions at the altar he set up in the house of God - Bethel. Leviticus 23:37; Philippians 2:17, 2 Timothy 4:6 6. Son of My Right Hand. What interesting details do you see in this sad account of the birth of Benjamin? Consider the location, and another significant birth that takes place in this very place. 7. A Terrible Betrayal. What does Ruben do and why is it especially dishonorable considering the context of this story? 8. Toledot of Isaac. Isaac's toledot began in 25:19 and concludes here. Write three key points from the life of Isaac that stand out to you personally. 9. Tales from a Genealogy. Note the interesting comments we get from this long list of Esau's descendants in Genesis chapter 36. Also note any names that stand out to you if you're familiar with later accounts about the nation of Israel. v. 6-7 (who does this remind you of?) v. 24 v. 31 v. 35

Read the following written by a man who was acquainted with living the wrong way and suffering the consequences, then living the right way and the blessing he found. What does he say about the "law?"

How would this kind of delight look in the church? In our work relationships? With our husbands?
