

I have found that time doesn't always heal wounds and time doesn't always fly. Time just tick-tocks on. But it doesn't have to be that way. Time can heal if you move toward healing. Time can fly or feel stagnant-it depends on your willingness to delight despite what you are dealing with. As you know by this season of your life, time will march on. It's what you choose to do in these moments that will determine your view and whether or not you became blessed or let bitterness set. Joseph spent years in prison, months as a slave, countless hours tormented and separated from all he knew and loved in his life. Twenty years of

his life would have tick-tocked along whether or not he choose to honor God – but he did. And as a result, every minute added up to hours, months, years of time deepening his empathy, his patience, his sincerity, and his faith. Time will slip by with or without you growing toward God today. Choose today to spend this time well.

Joseph had a choice in every circumstance we read throughout his Toledot. Each choice, as we saw in Genesis 45:1-9, led him and ultimately everyone in his life from the youngest brother to the greatest ruler to see and know God.

Read Psalm 63 and meditate on how God is providing for you today. Consider how He is making a way for you to choose to respond in a god-honoring way today.


On the left side write out circumstances you're facing today. It could be something going on with your personal life, your job, your family or loved ones.

Pray about each of those things. Pray with Psalm 63 in mind.

Then, on the right hand side, write how you will respond in line with the promises of Psalm 63 and in response to the Holy Spirit's prompting in your heart.

Maybe you've been resistant to a godly response. Perhaps bitterness or jealousy, anger or selfrighteousness has kept you from responding in a godly way.

Today is the day to submit all that to the LORD in prayer and to be able to say, like Joseph did, "it was not you (the issue you're facing) who sent me here, but God." And then, humbly, like Joseph,
